Thank you for the answer,

By gathering an actual information about visa policy one additional question arises:

One of our clients mentioned that there is an agreement between Czech Republic and Israel that regulates that a person entering Czech Republic may stay up to 90 days without counting the 180 days

period.

In other words- as example, Israeli may arrive for 89 days, then exit to Israel for minimum 1 day and arrive again, without waiting for 180 days to pass between the visits.

Could you please interpret the issue?
