thank you for your e-mail.

Please be informed that the Polish-Israeli bilateral agreement stipulates that Israeli citizens can stay in Poland for 90 consecutive days (without any other restrictions). If they leave Poland before this 90-days term passes, they may enter Poland again for another maximum 90 days.

Please also note that the issues concerning border crossing are the sole competence of the Border Guard of Poland. Thank you for the answer,

By gathering an actual information about visa policy one additional question arises:

One of our clients mentioned that there is an agreement between Poland and Israel that regulates that a person entering Poland directly (without crossing third country border) may stay in Poland up to 90 days without counting the 180 days period.

In other words- as example, Israeli may arrive for 89 days to Poland, then exit to Israel for minimum 1 day and arrive again, without waiting for 180 days to pass between the visits.

Could you please interpret the issue?
